NI(U)T Objective

National Investment Trust Ltd. (NITL) is the first and the largest Asset Management Company of Pakistan, formed in 1962. Wth approximately Rs. 87 billion assets under management as on September 30, 2014. The family of Funds of NIT comprises of five funds including 3 equity Funds and 2 fixed income nature Funds. NIT's tally of nationwide branches is 23, yet another milestone as no other Mutual Fund in Pakistan has such a vast network of nationwide branches. Further to cater to the matters relating to investments in NIT and day to day inquiries/issues of its unit holders, a state of the art Investors' Facilitation Centre is also in place. The Board of Directors of NITL consists of representatives of leading financial institutions, prominent industrialists and nominee of Gout. of Pakistan. The Company has been assigned an Asset Manager rating of "AMA2-" by PACRA, which reflects the company's very strong capacity to manage the risks inherent in the asset management business and the asset manager meets very high investment Committee of NITL.

Fund Commentary & Performance Review

KSE-100 witnessed sharp recovery by gaining 4.06% during the month of September 2014 to close at the level of 29,726. Sustained foreign inflows of about 53 mn USD from the foreign investors while the political situation also diffused to some extent helped the market to pull through from the bearish sentiments amplified from the events of last month. Though the heavy weight oil and gas sector underperformed the market during the month, however smaller sectors like pharma and auto significantly outperformed the market and lead the bullish rally. The monetary policy statement was also issued during the month. SBP noted that macroeconomic conditions are stabilizing. Inflation is declining, improvement in GDP growth in FY14 is expected to continue in FY15 and the fiscal indicators like budget deficit, government borrowings and debt profile are also improving. However, in view of challenges posed by the external sector and the economic disruptions caused by recent floods, SBP decided to take a cautious approach and maintain the Policy Rate at 10%.

During the month of September2014, the benchmark KSE-100 index gained 4.06% whereas your Fund's NAV appreciated by 7.33% during the same period thus giving an outperformance of 3.27%. On a YTD basis (July 14 to September 14), the KSE-100 index increased by 0.25% whereas the NAV of your Fund increased by 3.55%, thus, showing an out performance of 3.30%.

Future Outlook

The political temperature might have gone down recently but it still poses a threat to the market's stability in the near term. Peaceful resolution of the political disputes through meaningful dialogue may lift the investors' confidence in the future. Moreover smooth execution of high profile Govt transactions of OGDC secondary offerings and Sukuk offering cumulatively amounting to 1.3 bn USD approximately will be the key determinants of the market direction in the upcoming days.
