Daily average trading volumes declined by 1.27% MoM 132.62% 194.61% to 171mn shares from an average of 174mn shares traded in previous month. Major 3yrs pressure on the market was exerted due to foreign selling which amounted to almost 237.09% 187.10% 5yrs USD 53 million. # Disclosure regarding Tax on Bonus Shares – NI(U)T

Finance Act 2014 has introduced tax on bonus shares issued by companies. Most Equity Funds including NI(U)T Fund have challenged this on various legal grounds and have sought relief from the Court. The Court, in its order dated November 25, 2014, has granted interim relief by passing the restraining order whereby the Defendants, (issuers of the Bonus shares) are being refrained from deducting or transferring 5% withholding tax on Bonus shares issued by them to the CDC Account of the Income Tax department.

As an abundant caution, the NI(U)T Fund has made payment of Rs. 25.93 million as of November 30, 2015 which is equivalent to 5% value of the bonus shares, determined on the basis of day-end price on the first day of book closure. The market value of 5% bonus shares as on October 31, 2015 is Rs. 53.15 million.
